Jill Jackson is an award-winning veteran journalist and storyteller having covered the U.S. Congress and national political campaigns for CBS News' Evening News, CBS This Morning, Face the Nation and 60 Minutes plus Capitol News Connection with Public Radio International. She is also a former producer at National Public Radio.

During more than a decade on Capitol Hill, Jill reported on the creation and implementation of the Affordable Care Act, the near-economic collapse of 2008 and the subsequent financial sector reforms and stimulus legislation. She reported on numerous efforts to pass comprehensive immigration reform and tax reform, as well as moves to tackle climate change. She covered seven congressional election cycles and contributed to coverage of four presidential campaigns.

Most recently, Jill served as news director at one of the most innovative public radio newsrooms in the country, KUOW in Seattle. In that role, Jill was key to launching news podcasts, newsletters and identifying coverage priorities like business and growth, tech, homelessness, and the environment.

Jill served on the Washington Press Club Foundation board working to expand access to journalism opportunities for women and people of color. Jill was also on the board of the Congressional Radio and Television Correspondents' Association. She is a graduate of the Henry M. Jackson School of International Studies at the University of Washington.
